



I'm Soo Min, an independent animal rescuer who began my journey in animal welfare about 1.5 years ago. Originally from Penang, I first came to Kuala Lumpur temporarily while accompanying my daughter for her studies. What began as a short stay turned into a turning point in my life, as I found myself rooting deeply for the rescue community here. The experience I gained in feeding, rescuing, puppy adoption, and TNR (Trap-Neuter-Release) inspired me to stay on permanently and commit to this cause. To date, I have rescued and rehabilitated close to 45 dogs, successfully rehomed 35 puppies, and carried out more than 45 TNR cases. Each step in this journey has deepened my commitment to improving the lives of stray animals and addressing the root cause of overpopulation. At home, I share my life with two dogs - one of them a rescue who was abandoned at a factory area and has since become a cherished part of my family.

Outside of rescue, I hold a bachelor's degree in computer engineering and have 25 years of experience in the semiconductor software engineering industry. My professional background instilled in me the value of perseverance, problem-solving, and structured execution skills that now guide my rescue work.

Looking ahead, I hope to play a role in shaping positive changes for animal welfare in Malaysia. I am passionate about addressing the stray overpopulation issue through a systematic, holistic, and humane approach. I believe lasting impact can only be achieved when the community, government, and NGOs work together with shared responsibilities and compassion. What began as a donor's contribution has evolved into a personal mission: To get my hands dirty, learn from real rescue experiences, and directly contribute to giving stray animals a second chance at life. As I approach early retirement by the end of the year, I am ready to dedicate even more time and energy to this cause that has truly become my life's purpose.
